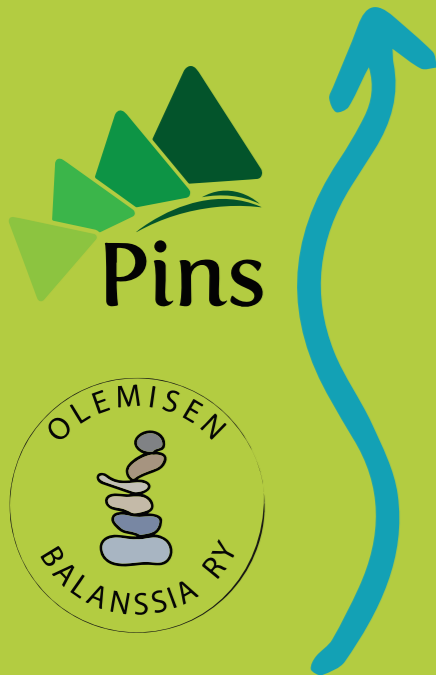

Croatia

November was a very interesting month for the Go remote project in Croatia. We are completing three local trainings (Web design, Accounting and Digital Media

Officer) and we are also in the process of a mentoring program to help young unemployed people with employment, in which are participating 8 experienced mentors from the fields of psychology and human resources.

Also, final preparations are underway for the 3rd Job speed dating event, which will take place on December 15th, as well as applications for MatchWork.

On November 21st, in Brussels, the organization of Euromontana (the European association of mountain areas) held a conference called “Skills for mountains in transition”. We can proudly say that one of the speakers was the representative of the Local development agency Pins, Natalija Mamula, with the topic “Remote work: an opportunity for mountain areas”.

She presented the Go remote project in front of a large audience that came to the conference from

Also, November 23rd in Blagoevgrad, Bulgaria, we participated in the final meeting of the project together with all other partners, where we discussed past and upcoming activities with the hope of collaborating on some future projects.

Cyprus

With the completion of the International Training Course in Digital Marketing both e-courses and LIVE Sessions, the Cypriot team has been focusing on evaluating the vast number of students that participated in these educational opportunities and review the assignments to issue certificates of participation.

Challenges both technical and

time have been overcome by the positive feedbacks received by the students that participated in either trainings.

The International Trainings were as success both for the Beneficiary Countries (Cyprus, Latvia, Bulgaria and Croatia) as well as within the European Dimension as we had participants from Bosnia - Herzegovina, Germany, Greece, Turkey, Sweden, Iceland, Spain and Romania.

The completion of the Local Digital Marketing that was held in parallel of the International Digital Marketing course was also a success, helping youth either to find speedy jobs in the digital marketing field or by inspiring them to become either remote freelancers in this field or open their own small enterprise in the digital sphere, both helping out reducing youth unemployment in

Europe.

We attended with all our partners in the [TPM Bulgaria that was held in Blagoevgrad in Bulgaria between the 23rd and 24th of November](#). An emotional event as it is the last TPM that will be held within this amazing project.

We continue now and focusing on the rest of the job match making events, International and Local Conference and the ongoing Mentoring Program.
